

Dear Water Purveyor:

Please be advised that your system qualifies for reduced lead and copper monitoring. Bureau of Safe Drinking Water Implementation (Bureau) records indicate that lead and copper results obtained from samples taken during three (3) consecutive annual monitoring periods (i.e., 2008, 2009 & 2010) were below the federally defined actions levels for lead and copper. Therefore, the sampling frequency for lead and copper has been reduced to once every 3 years in accordance with the Federal regulations 40 CFR 141.86(d)(4)(iii). As a result, you must comply with the following monitoring frequency below.

Lead and copper sampling is next due in **2013**, with sample collection occurring between **June 1<sup>st</sup> and September 30<sup>th</sup>**. The number of samples required for each system is based on the residential population served. Our records indicate that your systems population is 8000. **A minimum of twenty (20) lead and copper samples are required in 2013.** Please consult 40 CFR 141.86(c) to verify the minimum number of samples required if there are any changes in the populations served.

Please be advised that if the results of this sampling indicate that an action level has been exceeded, sampling must return to the standard monitoring requirements for number and frequency, public education may be required, and a corrosion control recommendation with supporting data will also be required.
