Congratulations! It is with great pleasure that the New Jersey Forest Service informs you that Glen Ridge Borough has been awarded a 2009 Green Communities grant in the amount of \$3000. This award has been endorsed by the New Jersey Community Forestry Council.

The major goal of the state's Community Forestry Program is to educate all 566 municipalities in the state about the benefits of developing their own distinctive community forestry program and to offer support for these programs. As a community's program develops, the extent of its tree cover will increase and the vitality of its trees will improve. It is our experience that this will lead to greater awareness and appreciation of the benefits of trees.

Subject: Certified Recycling Coordinators

Since its passage in January of this year, the Department has received numerous inquiries concerning the Recycling Enhancement Act (P.L. 2007, c.311) (REA). One provision of particular concern is that which requires counties and municipalities to designate one or more persons as the county or municipal Certified Recycling Coordinator. In order to gain this certification, successful completion of the "Certified Recycling Professionals" training, as detailed below, must be accomplished.

With the passage of the "New Jersey Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act", in April, 1987, each municipality and county in the state was required to designate one or more persons as the official recycling coordinator. Since that time, to provide these individuals with appropriate professional skills, the Department has contracted with Cook College's Office of Continuing Professional Education (OCPE) to offer the "Certified Recycling Professionals" training curriculum. Though certification under this program was not a statutory requirement, several hundred public, and private, recycling professionals have received Certification status.

During the deliberative process leading to the passage of the REA, the Legislature determined that a certain level of expertise is necessary for those public employees designated as recycling coordinators. Going forward, the REA mandates that the Department can not accept the annual municipal recycling report and grant application unless it has been signed by a Certified Recycling Coordinator, starting with the 2010 report.

There are options for a county or municipality without a certified recycling coordinator on staff. The Act does not require each county or municipality to employ its own full time certified recycling coordinator, but to merely designate one. Therefore, "sharing" the services of a Certified Recycling Coordinator for the purposes of filing the


Dear Rob:

Cultural resources review of proposed project

Dear Mr. Rohal:

In accordance with NJAC 7:22-10, the Bureau of Program Development & Technical Services has reviewed the proposed project to determine if it will affect significant cultural resources. Based on the information submitted, the project consists of the replacement of 2,200 water meters in houses throughout Glen Ridge.

The majority of the Borough of Glen Ridge is located within the boundaries of the Glen Ridge Historic District, which is listed on the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places. Additional significant historic properties are also located within Glen Ridge. Replacement water meters will be installed by removing the existing meter in the interior basement of buildings and installing a replacement meter in the same location. In some cases, workers may have to access the curb stop, located between the curb and the sidewalk. In such cases, the work will result in no change to the permanent appearance of the Historic District. Therefore, the Bureau of Program Development and Technical Services has determined that the proposed project will have no effect on significant cultural resources. A cultural resources survey is not required for the project as it is currently proposed. Should the project change, a revised determination must be obtained from this office.


The following language is required in the project plans and specifications:

Standard Cultural Resources Language

- 1) *The Contractor cannot dispose of excess excavated material at, stockpile construction materials at, or obtain borrow material from properties which are listed or eligible for listing on the New Jersey or National Registers of Historic Places.*
- 2) *If unexpected archaeological resources are encountered during construction, the contractor must immediately halt all construction in the vicinity of the discovery and contact the Owner.*
- 3) *When the Owner is contacted by the Contractor in accordance with the above provisions, the Owner must immediately contact NJDEP-Municipal Finance and Construction-Technical Services at (609) 292-8961 or (609) 633-1170. The Bureau of Program Development & Technical Services will determine the appropriate actions, in accordance with NJAC 7:22-10, and federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation procedures.*
