You are encouraged to have copies of this packet available in your municipal building and to share this information openly with all residents in your community.

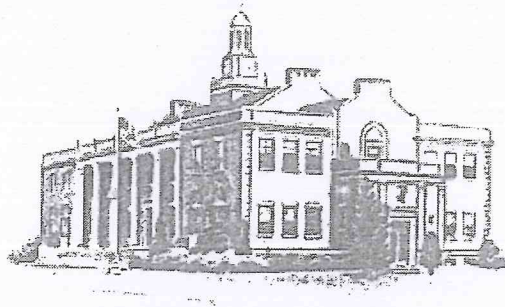
