RESOLUTION

GLEN RIDGE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II April 3, 2014

WHEREAS, in April, 2012, the Borough of Glen Ridge submitted applications to the appropriate Federal and State agencies to expand the Glen Ridge Historic District to include properties located in an area designated as the "Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II" and to include said properties in the National and New Jersey State Registers of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, in support of its application for designation on the National Register of Historic Places, the Borough submitted a Registration Form prepared by the Borough's historic preservation specialists, Connolly & Hickey Historical Architects, LLC, dated April 12, 2012, which included detailed information regarding all properties located in the "Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II" subject (hereinafter referred to as the "Registration Form"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough's federal and state applications to expand the Borough's historic district to include the properties located in the "Glen Ridge Historic District

Extension II" report were approved, and the Historic District Extension II properties are now included in both the National Register of Historic Places and the New Jersey State Register of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, Section 15.32.180.a of the Glen Ridge Historic Preservation Ordinance (the "Ordinance") provides that in the event any amendments are made to the State or National Registers of Historic Places which involve historic districts or landmarks within the Borough, the Historic Preservation Commission (the "Commission") shall consider those changes as possible amendments to the list of historic districts and landmarks established by the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough served legal notice upon the owners of all properties located in the "Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II" that the Commission would consider the proposed expansion of the Glen Ridge Historic District to include said properties at a special meeting of the Commission on March 19, 2014; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the aforesaid Ordinance, the Commission conducted a public hearing on the proposed nomination at a special meeting on March 19, 2014, at which time the Board considered the Registration Form and the testimony presented by Margaret M. Hickey, R.A., Historic Preservation

Specialist, as well as the testimony and comments from numerous members of the public, including the owners of properties proposed for historic designation; and

WHEREAS, upon review and consideration of the information provided at the public hearing, the Commission voted to recommend that the Historic Preservation Ordinance be amended and expanded to include the properties located in the "Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II" area based on the findings and conclusions set forth in the Registration Form.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Historic Preservation Commission of the Borough of Glen Ridge that the Commission hereby adopts the findings and conclusions contained in the National Register of Historic Places Registration Form, dated April 12, 2012, and based on that report, the Commission hereby recommends that the Borough Council amend the Historic Preservation Ordinance to include the properties located in the area designated as "Glen Ridge Historic District Extension II" in the Borough's list of historic districts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be delivered to the Borough Clerk and the Borough Council.


