RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO S-1352, WHICH MODIFIES THE OPEN PUBLIC RECORDS ACT (OPRA)

WHEREAS, S-1352, Makes many changes to the open public records act (OPRA); and

WHEREAS, including among these are the requirement that documents containing certain information concerning criminal investigations to be made available to the public within 24 hours or as soon as practicable; and

WHEREAS, the bill would also change the copying cost fee structure to a flat \$0.10 cents per page for each letter size sheet and \$0.15 cents per page for each legal size sheet; and

WHEREAS, it provides that the special service charge for an OPRA request requiring extraordinary equipment or effort be based on a posted hourly rate based on the actual direct cost if the charge includes a charge for time; and

WHEREAS, it provides that a personnel record containing disciplinary actions and settlement information on lawsuits or claims is not exempt from OPRA requests; and

WHEREAS, the bill would, also, define "immediate access" which must ordinarily be granted to "budgets, bills, vouchers, contracts, including collective negotiations agreements and individual employment contracts, and public employee salary and overtime information," to mean "within three hours for any request made before 2p.m. and it shall mean by 10a.m. of the next business day for any request made after 2p.m.;" and

WHEREAS, these requirements fail to account for the fact that different records request can have different 'degrees of difficulty' which could require the custodian to go through years of records on various matters, in various media, or which could be vague and confusing; and

WHEREAS, neither do they respect the need to ensure appropriate redaction of information, in order to protect the privacy rights of citizens and public employees; and

WHEREAS, neither does the new fee structure account for the time and difficulty often involved in the retrieval, review and appropriate redaction of public records; and

WHEREAS, at a time of fiscal stress, when state policy makers counsel local officials to decrease spending, this bill would force a greater investment in records keeping and dissemination, by requiring the custodian to do more and to do it all faster and, in many

instances, to do it cheaper.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Township of Cedar Grove does hereby express its opposition to S-1352, in its current form; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we encourage our State Senator and our Representatives in the General Assembly to oppose, with voice and vote, the imposition of the new mandates embodied in S-1352, in its current form; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to State Senator Kevin O'Toole, and Assembly Members David Russo and Scott Rumana, and all other Essex County municipalities, to Governor Christie, to Lieutenant Governor Guadagno, and to the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

Mr. Rohal,

Earlier this week we met with the Lager Run Chairperson, Mr. Daniel Murphy regarding the location of the post-run festivities. In the recent past the post -run event, which does include serving alcohol to the participants who are of legal age has been hosted by and in the parking lot of Fitzgerald's restaurant. This year the venue, which will take place on Sunday, June 27, 2010 is anticipating one thousand plus runners and the adjacent lot will not be conducive to hosting such a large crowd.

In the interest of public safety I recommend that the entire event start and finish at Hurrell field. This will assist the Borough in eliminating security and quality of life issues that would present themselves if the Herman Street parking lot and Herman Street itself were to be used. Crowd control, the serving of alcohol, noise from entertainment and announcers and the displacement of resident and commuter vehicles from the Herman Street lot and Herman Street itself are some of the main issues the police department will face if the event was to be held in the Herman Street parking lot. Using Hurrell field for such a large crowed would enable the officer's to utilize a fenced in site that is large enough to hold the number of persons attending and secure enough to maintain and contain any issues that may arise. It will also let us maintain security and pedestrian safety that would not be possible if such large numbers of runners were moving between the Herman Street parking lot and Herman Street itself.

Should the Borough Council agree with my recommendation it should be noted that the event will require a permit from the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control to serve alcohol. If I can be of any further assistance please do not hesitate to contact me regarding this issue.
