Councilman Dawson thanked Councilman Sachs for his years of service and he reported that the Councilman always worked with a very high level of experience.

Councilman Lisovicz called Councilman Sachs a selfless public servant and he stated that he will be missed.

Councilwoman Provost thanked Councilman Sachs for his years of service and stated that he always has been a great resource of information to the Council.

Borough Attorney Malyska reported that he has been Borough Attorney during all the years that Councilman Sachs has served on the Council. He stated that he will always remember him for his wisdom and his consciousness.

Attorney Malyska also thanked Mrs. Sachs for her years of service to the Borough.

Borough Administrator Rohal thanked Councilman Sachs for his guidance and support for the past 6 years and he stated that Councilman Sachs has always been an advocate for each Department at Borough Hall.

Former Montclair Mayor Robert Russo thanked Councilman Sachs for his many years of service.

Former Councilwoman Helene E. Kaplan stated that she has known the Sachs's for more than 40 years and that he is the longest serving Council member in the history of Glen Ridge. Mrs. Kaplan stated that Glen Ridge has been very fortunate to have Councilman Sachs on the Council and she thanked and congratulated the Mayor And Council. Councilwoman Kaplan also stated how pleased she is to see an equal split on this Council - 3 women and 3 men. This is also a Glen Ridge first.

Former Mayor Carl A. Bergmanson thanked Councilman Sachs for his many years of service and he stated that he played a major roll to him during his term as Mayor. Mr. Bergmanson also extended his best wishes to Councilwoman Seyffarth as she ascended to Finance Chairperson.

Library Director Sitnik, on behalf of the Library Board Of Trustees, thanked Councilman Sachs for his many years of service.

Everyone in attendance gave Councilman Sachs a standing ovation.

Mayor Hughes presented his second "State Of The Ridge" address to the citizens in attendance.

I know that this is a long meeting already, and I don't intend to make it any longer than necessary with my remarks. But I don't think we should rush through this meeting because this meeting, unlike any other meeting during the year, allows us to recognize the efforts put forth by all of the many volunteers who make up all of the committees and boards that do so much of the Town's business, it allows us to celebrate the retirement of a very special 4-term councilman in Myles Sachs - I'll have more to say on this is just a bit; it allows us to

officially welcome back to the Council for a well-deserved second term, Councilman Art Dawson - welcome back Art; and it gives us a chance to congratulate our newest Councilperson, Yvonne Provost and to welcome her as a valued member of the Council. Welcome Yvonne. This meeting also, gives me a chance to review what I feel are the accomplishments of 2008 and to set forth some goals for 2009.

First I would like to personally thank and recognize all of the volunteers who are leaving this year: Winnie Boswell, Anne Nielston and Jeffrey Darby for their years of service on our Channel 36 advisory committee. Kathy Weissenberger for her service and leadership as chairperson of MAC; Jerry Raymond for his many years of service on the board of Adjustment; and Kit Shackner for her service on Historic Preservation Committee. Kathy W. will continue to serve on MAC; Aubrey Blanda has agreed to take over as chair person with the help of Kathy and another new member, Leah Zweig. Although Kit Schackner is leaving Historic Preservation Committee, she has volunteered to help on the Channel 36 advisory Committee.

This year I have appointed 32 new volunteers to staff all of the various Town Boards and Committees. In total well over 100 volunteers are need to staff all of these bodies. We simply can't say it often enough: Glen Ridge depends on its volunteers to make things go.

Now Myles, I know that by resolution (and by the comments of our Council members) we have acknowledged your extraordinary career of service, but I would like to add my own two cents. 4 terms on the Council. Head of every committee except Public Safety. Mayor's delegate to the Health Board and to the Library Board. Architect of the first Municipal Bond Issue in this Town since 1931. Engineer of the first town-wide tax reassessment in 25 years. Before I knew better, I would have described you as a numbers guy. Now I would describe you as a policy guy first and a numbers guy second. Myles its hard to summarize all that you accomplished in the last 6 years: How about a perfect 6 in the number of years that Glen Ridge has qualified for extraordinary aid from the state You looked at our infrastructure as an asset in need of care and management, and it is in far better shape than it was 6 years ago, and the capital revolver is for the first time in many years fully funded as a result of your stewardship. When I was thinking about this, I was reminded of a comment Myles once made when we were discussing replacement of one of our old dump trucks --"I may be old and tired" he said, "but that truck is even older and more tired than I am."

Under your leadership, Myles, all of our Town assets are improved, and our budget is in sound shape. I hope I can make a similar claim when I leave office. Myles, it has been a pleasure to work with you on the Council and as mayor. For all of us, you set the

gold Standard for what it means to be a Council person and a volunteer. I wish you and Dorothy all of the best.

Now let me talk very briefly about some of the highlights of last year.

- the Planning and Development Committee oversaw big changes at the Ford Motor site and we welcome into town a new Panera and a new Seven Eleven Store. After years of trying we finally got good news on the Benson St. Train Station and we can look forward to seeing that building restored into something useful and beautiful in the new year.
- the Community Affairs Committee has led us in several new and exciting directions. In May, along with our environmental committee we hosted our first Eco fair that introduced a series of new Green initiatives in town. Cardboard for the first time was added as a recyclable, and hazardous waste materials are now collected at the Town yard on the second Saturday of each month. We also conducted our first energy audit of all or town facilities and we included many of the recommendations from that report in the improvements made with the Bond referendum money. A new coordinating committee was created, the Caring Community Alliance to serve as a coordinator and a resource to the many volunteer service organizations we have in town.
- our parks and Recreation committee oversaw the complete rebuild of Forest Ave Field; new fencing, bleachers, and a rebuilt shed at Hurrell field, and many improvements at the freeman tennis Courts, including a complete restoration of court #7. More importantly, Parks and Recreation was able to keep all of our programs running at full capacity even though forest Ave field was out of use and Carteret field usage was severely restricted to protect the new grass surface there.
- the Public Works Committee was extremely busy overseeing the expenditure of over \$4M in bond funds in 2008. During 2008, all of the buildings at the town yard were substantially improved; Borough Hall reroofed and waterproofed; the library was fully restored; and the Public Safety department dramatically improved, and its communication system brought into the 21st century. That's not all. Forest Ave was repaved and as a carry over from 2007, hillside Ave was also repaved.
- the Finance and Administration oversaw the financial administration of the first municipal bond undertaken by this town in 77 years. In total, over \$4m in funds were expended on a variety of asset improvement projects. While all of this was going on, Finance and administration engineered the first town-wide tax reassessment in 25 years, a reassessment ordered by the Court. This process is nearly complete. Out of 2200 homes.

- reassessed, 23 remain unresolved. Last year, in a year where aid from the State was reduced, and fees and interest income lowered by the economy, the municipal tax increase came in at under 2%.
- finally the Public Safety Committee continued its efforts to streamline the department and our codes. During the year we saw an overall reduction in our crime statistics and when we saw an increase in burglaries, the committee acted quickly and aggressively to address this issue including a first ever request for temporary assistance from the Essex County Sherriff.

For 2009, we can expect to see the following:

1. continue to push green initiatives and work with the environmental committee to increase recycling and use of alternate energies in the Borough. In 2009 the Council will adopt a paperless policy and use laptops and electronic mail and document transfer. We will look to purchase a new jitney in 2009 and that vehicle will be powered by natural gas or bio fuel. We will look for grants to install solar panels an we will look for ways to continue to reduce municipal waste through recycling and composting.
2. create a shade tree commission to protect and improve this important town asset.
3. implement approved bond funded improvements at Hurrell field with a new natural grass infield and a synthetic track.
4. continue improvements to the interior of Borough Hall with bond funds, or if we are successful with a \$650,000.00 State Historic trust fund Grant.
5. install new water meters to reduce loss in the system due to old and slow meters and to encourage conservation of this resource.
6. finish lead water abatement program to eliminate all lead pipe connections from Town mains to residential service.
7. study the town's sewer system and map out system wide needs for improvements.
8. re-energize the development of the Glen as a passive use green site in town. The gazebo, bridge and lighting in the glen have all opened it up to greater use. We need to look for new ways to improve and use the Glen. I would like to target a five acre site that the town owns adjacent to Glenfield park for use as an open air classroom. We need to look for private or governmental funding to support the revitalizing of this area.
9. study ways to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety in the borough.
