Councilor Lefkovits, Chair of the Public Works Committee reported that since our last meeting, the Road Crew was out patching pot holes. 1.5 tons of temporary patching material were used throughout the Borough. In the spring, the potholes will be permanently patched. Additionally, the storm water catch basins were cleaned and inspected before and during the rain storms we experienced.

Our crews have also been working on making improvements to the Municipal Complex. They have been cleaning and painting in the lower level of the building. We have also been making improvements to our boiler system to improve its efficiency. A dedicated hot water boiler has been installed to satisfy the heating requirements of the library. The steam boilers that feed the public safety and administrative portions of the building have new controls installed. This project should reduce our overall natural gas usage and extend the life of our boilers.

The Shade Tree Commission is finalizing the planting program for Spring of 2018. The anticipate the project being completed by the end of May.

The Clerk received bids for the 2016-17 Road Project on February 22, 2018. The project will be funded using NJDOT Municipal Aid grants, Community Development Block Grants and capital funds. Bidding was extremely competitive. We received twelve bids. The lowest four bidders were within \$14,000 of each other. I will be presenting Resolution 53-18 to award this project tonight. NJDOT and CDBG will have to review and approve the contractor. Once this occurs we can then schedule a preconstruction meeting and determine the final project schedule.
