Dear Mayor Hughes,

I am writing to you to enlist your support in an effort to restore equity into the distribution of state aid to schools across the State of New Jersey.

During my years of service as a legislator, I have devoted significant effort to unraveling the mystery that surrounds our current school funding formula; a complicated formula that has been mandated by unelected judges authoring court decisions that have resulted in outlandish funding schemes that defy common sense.

Your school district is one of the many that are unfairly treated by the State when school aid dollars are appropriated. I have determined that your town only gets back \$0.00 for each dollar it sends to Trenton.

Let's be clear, our State Constitution mandates the progressive collection of taxes for property tax relief, and also provides for the distribution of school aid for the "equal benefit of all of the people of the State." The Constitution also states that "the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools." Note that it says the Legislature, not the Court.

I have researched our income tax revenue projections for next year and have found that if those revenues were distributed equally to each student, it would equate to \$7,481.00 per student. Your town currently receives \$0.00 in state aid. Given your student enrollment projections, adoption of my plan would result in an increase in state school aid for your school district of \$13,989,470.00 annually. This change would provide meaningful property tax relief for your town now.

I have introduced fair school funding legislation that will comply with the mandates of our Constitution, and I need your help to get it passed into law.

WHEREAS, the current distribution of state aid for education to the schools has not been distributed in a fair and equitable manner to provide property tax relief to all the citizens of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Article III., Paragraph 1, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "The powers of government shall be divided among three distinct branches, the legislative, executive, and judicial. No person or persons belonging to or constituting one branch shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others, except as expressly provided in this Constitution;" and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section IV, Paragraph 1, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools for the instruction of all children in the State between the ages of five and eighteen years;" and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section IV, Paragraph 2, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "the fund for the support of free public schools . . . shall be annually appropriated to the support of free public schools, and for the equal benefit of all the people of this State;" and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section I, Paragraph 7.a. of the New Jersey State Constitution states, the income tax is to be "annually appropriated . . . exclusively for the purpose of reducing or offsetting property taxes;" and

WHEREAS, this body can no longer bear the burden of the continued diversion of its fair share of state school aid for the students between the ages of five and eighteen years of age who reside within this jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the ______ do hereby call upon the Legislature of the State of New Jersey to fulfill its constitutionally assigned duty to distribute the state aid for education to the school districts in this state in a fair manner that is for the equal benefit of all the people of the state and not by means that are prejudiced by the actions of special interests that may have been presented before the Court or other venue.

WHEREAS, Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission ("PVSC") operated a sewage treatment system that serves, and is funded via user charges paid by, 48 municipalities in Passaic, Bergen, Essex and Hudson Counties; and

WHEREAS, from 2005 until 2011, the amounts assessed by the PVSC to the municipalities served by the system have increased approximately 50%; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of New Jersey and the current Executive Director of the PVSC have taken recent actions to reduce the salaries, eliminate unnecessary employees and otherwise eliminate waste and mismanagement within the organization; and

WHEREAS, these actions should save the PVSC millions of dollars annually; and

WHEREAS, the PVSC established assessments to be charged to the municipalities served by the system for the Year 2011 before the recent actions to affect savings; and

WHEREAS, municipalities throughout New Jersey, including those served by the PVSC, are struggling to live within a 2% tax levy cap.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough of Hasbrouck Heights, County of Bergen, New Jersey that the PVSC should take the necessary steps to establish a total of the savings realized by the cost-cutting actions thus far, appropriate the savings among the municipalities served by the system, reduce the 2011 assessments accordingly and issue the revised billings before the date by which municipalities must approve their 2011 budgets and the Governor and Legislature of the State of New Jersey take all reasonable and/or necessary actions to ensure that the PVSC can and does take the actions requested in this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Chris Christie, the 38th District Legislators, the New Jersey State League of Municipalities, the New Jersey Conference of Mayors and the Clerks of all municipalities served by the PVSC.
