Dear Mr. Hughes:

I am writing to urge you to change the permit only parking policy at the Hillside Avenue lot. In short, non-permit parking should be allowed on weekends to facilitate travel into the city.

On Saturday, November 6, I parked in the Hillside Avenue lot to accompany my family into New York City. The signage does indicate that permits are required, but on Saturdays and Sundays, this lot is empty. The sign is ambiguous when one considers how these lots work in surrounding areas. For example, at the Walnut street station in Montclair, the lot is available for non-permit use on the weekends.

I know that you worked hard with your colleagues at NJ Transit to get weekend train service for Glen Ridge Residents. The absence of parking spaces prevents Glen Ridge residents from availing themselves of this important service.

I also wanted to alert you to what seems like an inconsistent approach to enforcement on permit parking. The lot on Hermann Avenue has a similar sign regarding permit parking. On that same Saturday, November 6th, I went to the library. After receiving the parking ticket, I was sure to park on the street. This lot, like the lot on Hillside avenue was empty, but I also observed that of the 10 or so vehicles parked there, only half had permits. None of those cars were ticketed.

I don't think the solution is to ticket those car but rather to provide some kind of means for folks to use those spaces on the weekends. Perhaps a weekend permit? Or a Glen Ridge resident sticker to allow parking in those spaces would be a good approach.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. I look forward to your reply.

BJN:cp Enclosure RESOLUTION URGING IMMEDIATE PASSAGE OF "TOOLKIT" LEGISLATION

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has the highest property taxes in the United States; and

WHEREAS, earlier this year, the Governor and Legislature approved a new 2% cap on the amount of growth local property taxes can rise in a given year; and

WHEREAS, the Governor and Legislature agreed to add a proviso to the 2% cap that various "tools" would be provided to municipalities in order to implement the new 2% spending cap; and

WHEREAS, such "tools" have been sent by the Governor to both houses of the NJ Legislature but have not been enacted to date; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the "tools" needed, the Governor has promised an overhaul of the pension system, but in his last budget proposal failed to pay even one cent for the state portion of the needed pension costs, thereby adding to the unfunded liability of the overall program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clifton duly paid its fair share of pension contribution in our 2009 budget - that pension contribution constituted 7.6 tax points out of a total of the 8.7 increase that passed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Clifton calls upon the NJ Senate and NJ Assembly to immediately pass the long overdue legislation to provide Clifton and all other New Jersey municipalities the needed "tools" to deal with the new spending cap which will greatly impact the various options municipalities will need to weigh during their forthcoming deliberations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Clifton calls upon the Governor to provide the needed state pension contribution for the year ahead and, in concert with the NJ Legislature, enact long overdue meaningful reforms which provide for financial stability in the short and long term for all contributing levels of government; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Clifton calls upon the Governor to declare a fiscal emergency and to implement a wage freeze for all public employees for a period of no less than two years after existing contracts have lapsed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governor and State Legislature also raise the amount of health care contributions for all public employees from the existing 1.5% of salary to an amount no less than 20% of the premium (or equivalent for self-insured entities); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be provided to Governor Chris Christie; to Senator Nia H. Gill; to Assemblywoman Sheila Y. Oliver; to Assemblyman Thomas P. Giblin; to the Clerk of the New Jersey State Senate; to the Clerk of the New Jersey Assembly; to the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders; to the North Jersey Herald News; to the Bergen Record; to the Clifton Journal; to all municipalities within Passaic, Bergen and Essex Counties; to the New Jersey State League of Municipalities; and to the New Jersey Conference of Mayors.
